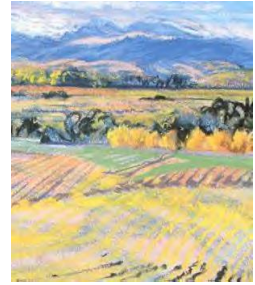

Fred spoke to us about the importance of feeding the soil. Fred uses compost to support the, available nutrient content, minerals, microorganisms and water retention that a rich soil provides to your vines. The healthier the vine, the more disease resistant and drought tolerant the vine is.
