

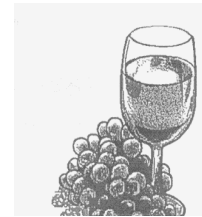

### ***FEBRUARY MEETING SUMMARY – OAK USAGE & BARREL ALTERNATIVES***

Martin McCarthy of Tonnellerie Radoux discussed the use of oak in all phases of the winemaking process including using oak in fermentation. Radoux provides oak in many forms and each has its unique place in the winemaking process. Martin discussed how oak in fermentation reduces vegetal character of wine, reduces oxidation and enhances color. We closed out the meeting tasting barrel samples of wines made using different oak types – powder, granulate, and chips. Thank you, Martin.

### ***MARCH MEETING – THE FINE ART OF FINING - Bob Peak, The Beverage People***

Bob will present this discussion at the Winemaker Magazine May conference in Napa. I believe most of us don't do much fining as we don't fully understand it. Bob will take some of the mystery out this activity. Different fining agents can improve quality by altering defects in wines as well as improving clarity. There are quite a few fining materials and each has its own beneficial aspect. Let's hear about it. To close out the meeting I would like five volunteers to bring their wine and discuss it. This time I would like it to be a wine that you feel good about, and if there is a unique aspect to it, all the better. We'll try defective wines another time. It will probably take two bottles each. If you would like to present a wine, give me a call.
